The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Morrice Elementary contains students in grades Preschool through sixth. The average enrollment for the past four years has been 350 students; with a current enrollment of 356 students.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The School Improvement Team (SIT) has been helpful in guiding the school improvement efforts in the Elementary Building this year. Extensive goals are in place for improving ELA (reading and writing), Math, Science, and Social Studies. Our school improvement focus at the Elementary Building has been to ensure student success by improving student achievement at all levels. In addition to this, we have worked on creating a productive learning environment. As we do this we are also transitioning to the Common Core for math and ELA. This upcoming year we will work with the high school to develop a vertically aligned curriculum ELA.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OUR SCHOOL

The Elementary school provides education for students in kindergarten through sixth. Elementary students study core subjects such as mathematics, science, English language arts, social studies, and physical education. Elementary students also receive instruction in computers, music, band, and library.

4. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL

Morrice Elementary School's curriculum aligns to state standards in English language arts, Math, Science and Social Studies. The district has recently implemented a new core reading series for the 2010-2011 school year and will continue to do so in the 2013-2014 school year. This reading program is coupled with existing research based best practice interventions. In grades 2nd and 3rd grade we will be piloting a new program titled Walk to Read. This program will help us work with students who are continuing to struggle in the areas of fluency and comprehension. Students will receive core instruction for a time period, then Walk to Read to receive specific interventions based on their need, and finally those who need additional intervention will receive Response to Intervention for a period of time. This format will allow teachers to intervene when students are struggling and help them small group. In addition to this, the district has also purchased a new core math curriculum and implemented it in the 2012-2013 school year. We are currently creating Quarterly Assessments to assess students on their math knowledge by utilizing formative assessments to gain this information. Morrice Elementary School will focus this year on aligning the math and science curriculum to state standards and Common Core standards.

During the 2012-2013 school year, teachers utilized the Next Generation science standards to create a curriculum that was aligned by each grade-level. Teachers created power standards, learning targets, I Can statements and common vocabulary to aide in the development of the newly developed science curriculum. During the 2013-2014 school year, teachers will begin to create common quarterly assessments as well.
