Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Morrice Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-2022 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given any of these labels.

The M-Step data for 3rd grade ELA content show 30.8% of this student group were proficient, and the state average for this same group was 42.8%. Morrice Elementary has had a challenge due in part due to COVID-19; the past two years have been a challenge to provide a consistent instructional platform for the students. We are currently supporting grades K - 6th with targeted ELA support with trained adults using data to determine the supports each student needs. We are monitoring students' progress as a school a minimum of three times a year, and for students receiving the ELA support, they are progress monitored weekly. The targeted support in connection with student data from progress monitoring allows us to ensure we are helping students close proficiency gaps.

State law requires that we also report additional information on the following:

- 1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL: Students enroll in Morrice Elementary and are placed in the appropriate grade level based on age and academic achievement.
- 2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: Morrice Area Schools has a new Superintendent, a new K-12 Principal, School Improvement Facilitator, and Student Success Coordinator. These people and positions are updating the School Improvement Plan focused on improving student achievement.

- 3. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION, AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL: Morrice Area School is in the process of purchasing a new math and ELA curriculum for the 2022-2023 school year.
- 4. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS: Data in Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies from the state's M-STEP and MME tests may be found at https://bit.ly/3GVH6nb, AER Combined Report. In addition, Morrice Area School assesses students in kindergarten, first and second grades in Reading and Math. We use the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA) and NWEA Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) summary assessments to determine proficiency.
- 5. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: The October 2021 Parent-Teacher Conferences had a participation rate of 98% (258 of 262) by parents meeting with their students' teacher.

Morrice Area Schools has a strong tradition of being a small district while still providing our students an educational program to meet the needs of all learners. Morrice Elementary Teachers and Staff are working hard to support all student achievement. They have welcomed the new leadership and have begun the work of curriculum mapping to lay the groundwork for us to improve our rigor to improve student achievement outcomes. Morrice Elementary has a bright future because of the dedicated staff and the families who support it.
