Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Morrice Jr/Sr High. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Daniel Nolen for assistance.

For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given any of these labels.

Looking at SAT data from the 2021-2022 school year, 60% of the students did meet proficiency for Reading & Writing. We are currently supporting grades 6th - 8th with targeted ELA support with trained adults using data to determine the supports each student needs. We monitor students' progress as a school a minimum of three times a year, and students receiving ELA support are progress monitored weekly. All 6th-8th grade students also have additional Math support that allows them extra support at their individual level. This math intervention is progress monitored biweekly. The targeted support in connection with student data from progress monitoring allows us to ensure we are helping students close proficiency gaps. We are continuing with Student Assistance Team (SAT) meetings monthly for all grade levels with teachers, Student Success Coordinator, and administration to review student academics, attendance, and behavior. These monthly meetings with key adults ensure we are monitoring all students so we can support them toward the goal of academic proficiency. We have also implemented a new math and ELA curriculum and have been meeting regularly to support teachers with the implementation of the new curriculums.

- 1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL: Junior High Students are placed in the correct grade level based on age and the grade level as stated in the MSDS. High School students are placed in the correct grade level based on MSDS and total credits earned.
- 2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: Morrice Area Schools has a School Improvement Plan that focuses on academic growth. To facilitate this, we have implemented new MTSS structures and adopted new ELA and Math curriculums.
- 3. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION, AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL: Morrice Area School is in the first year of implementation of a new Math and ELA curriculum. We are also in the process of adopting a new Science and Social Studies curriculum. All of the curriculums can be accessed by contacting the central office.
- 4. In addition, Morrice Area School assesses students in grades 7th through 11th in Reading and Math. We use the NWEA Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) summary assessments to determine proficiency.
- 5. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: We had 16.13% parent participation in parent-teacher conferences this year.
